The county will provide part of the required salary to pay a George Reed Home Economics teacher for the Tabor High School. Oct 25, 1934, 10:153.

The Board of Education requested an additional \$5,000 to be included in the budget for two additional classrooms in Tabor City Schools. May 27, 1935, 10:228.

The Board of Education was loaned funds to purchase land for school funds in Tabor City. Dec 4, 1944, 12:102.

A loan from the State Literary Fund was authorized to build a new high school gym. Dec 5, 1949, 13:46; Dec 22, 1949, 13:51.

#### TAX COLLECTION

The sheriff was notified to give an additional bond for the collection of state taxes. May 31, (Jun 1,2,3,4), 1869; UN:73; Jun 30, 1869, UN:78.

The sheriff was instructed to pay into the state treasury school fund forty-five cents on each tax collected in 1869. Sep 26, 1870, UN:159.

W. Q. Maulsby failed to show receipts for full settlement of the county taxes and state taxes, he was released from collecting taxes. Jul 7, 1874, UN:347.

The county treasurer was authorized to receive money from the past sheriff which he collected from the taxpayers. Aug 15, 1874, UN:359.

The tax collector was allowed until the first day of May to settle with the county treasurer. Feb 8, 1875, UN:383.

The error in taxes charged against the sheriff from 1875-1877 was corrected and refunded to the county funds; amounts and funds listed. Jan 8, 1878, UN:533.

The Board ordered that the list of the town of Whiteville school tax for the year 1896-97 be made out by the Register of Deeds and given to the sheriff for collection. Jan 3, 1897, 2:358.

#### TAX COLLECTION

The Board resolved to provide discounts and penalties in collection of taxes for 1924. Oct 8, 1924, 7:249.

The Board provided discounts and penalties in tax collection for 1923. Oct 1, 1924, 7:41.

Tax collector was instructed to collect privilege tax on an out of county and out of state dry cleaning and laundry businesses operating in the county. Jun 5, 1933, 10:2.

All taxes collected by the tax collector will be deposited in Waccamaw Bank and Trust Company. Sep 17, 1934, 10:140.

Deputy sheriff was paid 20% for schedule "B" taxes collected from non-residents operating in the county. Jun 3, 1935, 10:226.

The tax collector was authorized to collect the county's levy of schedule "B" tax. Jul 5, 1935, 10:240.

Full settlement was made for all taxes due the county. Oct 6, 1938, 11:51.

The Board of Education received a proposition from the Commissioners suggesting that they relinquish their claim on uncollected school taxes to help defer their indebtedness to other county funds. Sep 12, 1940, 11:292.

Tax collector was authorized to collect all taxes set forth in the tax books. Aug 1, 1949, 13:12.

#### TAXATION

The Board requested state legislation allowing them to have a special tax law for this county to raise the additional revenue needed. Dec 1, 1869, UN:112.

The school tax levy was postponed to give the Board time to confer with the school committees and the county examiner. Jun (6,7,8), 1870, UN:138.

The trustees of Bug Hill Township were authorized to levy a tax for general expenses. Feb 6, 1871, UN:170

A resolution was passed to defer levying county taxes until the revenue bill is passed in the state legislature. Mar 6, 1871, UN:175.

The school committees were instructed to meet with the Board concerning a school tax levy. Jun 5, 1871, UN:186.

The clerk to the Board was instructed to request a copy of the Special Act authorizing the Board to levy a special tax. Jun 5, 1871, UN:187.

The Tatum Township officials were authorized to levy a tax in that township. Dec 4, 1871, UN:221.

The officials of Bug Hill Township were authorized to levy a tax to build a barge for crossing the Seven Creeks. Apr 1, 1872, UN:240.

#### TAXATION

Tax levies were passed; rates listed. May 21, 1872, UN:249.

The officials of Tatum Township were authorized to levy a tax to pay expenses; rate listed. Nov 4, 1872, UN:277.

The officials of Williams Township were authorized to levy a tax of \$9.00 to pay for their services. Mar 3, 1873, UN:286.

Township taxes were levied on Whiteville and Tatum Townships to defray expenses of those townships; amounts listed. Aug 6, 1877, UN:507.

The Board requested the state legislature to allow them to levy a special tax for general county purposes. Feb 4, 1889, 1:571.

#### TAXATION

A special school election resulted in twelve votes cast for a special tax and four votes cast against the special tax, Dec 2, 1907, 4:7.

Citizens of Fair Bluff requested a special school election. Dec 7, 1908, 4:118.

A special school tax election was held in Fair Bluff Township. Jan 4, 1909, 4:144.

A special school election was requested by citizens of Bogue Township. May 4, 1908, 4:44-45.

A special school tax election was held on December 14, 1908; results listed. Sep 6, 1909, 4: 200-201.

The citizens of South Williams Township requested a special school tax election; terms listed. Dec 6, 1909, 4:228.

Citizens of Chadbourne Township requested a special school tax election; terms listed. Apr 4, 1910, 4:274-275.

#### TAXATION

Ransom Township asked for a special school election to determine if an annual tax would be levied on property to supplement the school fund. Aug 4, 1913, 5:115.

The citizens of Bug Hill Township petitioned the Board for a special school election to determine if an annual tax would be levied on property to supplement the school fund. Nov 9, 1913, 5:140.

#### TAXATION

The citizens of Williams Township asked for a special school election to determine if an annual tax will be levied on property to supplement the school fund. Nov 3, 1913, 5:141.

The citizens of Tatum Township asked for a special school election to determine if an annual tax would be levied. Aug 3, 1914, 5:187.

The Board was petitioned for a special school election to decide if an annual tax will be levied on property and poll. Aug 3, 1914, 5:188-189.

J. F. Long, R. J. Suggs, Barry Suggs, M. G. Suggs, and R. H. Suggs were notified to show cause why they should not be entered for a special school tax in Bug Hill district #4. Jul 10, 1916, 5:347.

The Board approved a special tax election for a supplemental school tax for the district beginning on the Whitehall Road aV80den. County line. Aug 7, 1916, 5:352.

The Board approved a special tax election for a supplemental school fund in Columbus County. Aug 7, 1916, 5:352.

Taxes were settled for drainage in Chadbourn. Aug 2, 1926, 8:114.

An investigation was made as to the legality of the special school tax rate imposed on Lees District P. May 6, 1929, 9:33.

Notice was given for an election in Whiteville Township special taxing district #8. Aug 5, 1929, 9:70, 71.

#### TAXATION

A resolution was passed setting the tax levy of ten cents for each hundred dollars valuation. Jun 19, 1933, 10:8.

The board adopted a resolution concerning drainage taxes for the county. Feb 17, 1936, 10:331,332.

Board approved tax levies to repay interest and principal on bonds issued from 1922-1930. Feb 21, 1941, 11:362-363.

A special school tax election was authorized. Jan 7, 1941, 12:233-234.

Special tax election results revealed that a majority of Whiteville citizens were against a proposed school tax. Apr 12, 1967, 15:701-702.

The schedule of discounts for prepayments of taxes in effect in the taxing unit of Columbus County on June 30, 1971 shall continue until November 1, 1971. Jul 19, 1971, 16:471.

A motion was passed that the tax collector be relieved of the duty of collecting taxes over ten years old. May 15, 1972, 16:561.

The budget for the fiscal year 1973-1974 will be prepared on the assessed valuation of \$149,000,000 at a rate of 88% collection of taxes. May 14, 1973, 16:697.

Tax collector was instructed to collect privilege tax on out of county and out of state dry cleaning and laundry businesses operating in the county. Jun 5, 1933, 10:2.

A bill was enacted to define and impose a license tax on itinerant photographers and their agents and employees. Aug 5, 1957, 14:267.

A resolution was passed adopting a contract between the county and Fair Bluff for the taxation of Cole's Fire, Ambulance and Rescue Squad. Jun 4, 1979, 19:127-128.

The clerk was authorized to make the necessary corrections on the tax lists and make copies of each. May 18, 1875, UN:397.

The officials of each township were instructed to list the property in their township and report to the Board. Mar 6, 1876, UN:436; May 15, 1876, UN:446.
