Mobile/Manufactured Homes Permit - Checklist

*Before a Mobile/Manufactured Home is moved, delivered and/or installed to a new location you must obtain and/or make application of the following:

1) GIS/E-911 Address issued by the Columbus County Addressing/GIS Department

- If subdividing land, address is provided as each parcel is built.

2) Zoning Permit issued by jurisdiction – <u>IF applicable</u>

- If located within a flood zone an Elevation Certificate will be required prior to a permit being issued.
 - o A finished construction elevation certificate will need to be supplied to the Columbus County Building Inspections office before a certificate of occupancy can be issued.

3) Septic Tank Approval Permit or Building Permit Impact Statement – IF applicable

- Columbus County Building Inspections needs a copy of the following documents before a final inspection is scheduled:
 - o Operation Permit
 - o Well Permit

4) Legal documentation

- All documentation must have the serial number, year, make, and model information available.
- Examples:
 - o Form 500 from dealer
 - o Title
 - o Purchase agreement
- You will need this information to obtain your PIN card from the Power Company servicing your site.

5) Contractor information

- An application for each trade must be filled out.
- Permits required may be obtained by the residence owner if the residence is going to be occupied by the <u>said</u> residence owner for one full year AND the said residence owner is performing the work.
- If the permits are not issued to the owner, a state qualified licensed professional in the associated profession must apply for the permits.
 - Professionals obtaining permits for their sub-contractors will need to provide Columbus County Building Inspections office with a notarized letter stating permission to pick up the permits. All notarized documents will be kept on file with Columbus County Building Inspections.

6) Power Company Information

- Provide the information of the Power Company servicing your site.
 - o If Progress Energy is servicing your site, will need to supply Columbus County Building Inspections with the eight (8) digit premise number.

7) Property Identification Number Card (PIN)

- Obtain a PIN card for the construction site at the Tax Office
 - o The PIN card will need to be signed by one of the following individuals:
 - Coley Kinlaw, Randy Greene
 - o If the residence is being purchased from another individual:
 - The Tax Office will need the information of the current or previous owner of the home.
 - o If the residence is located in another County:
 - The Tax Office will need proof of the taxes being paid in that County.
- Obtain a moving permit from the Tax Office if the residence is being moved by someone other than a dealer.

*Any commercial work or any new residence in which the work or value of the project exceeds \$40,000, are required to purchase NC Title Lien Insurance at http://liensnc.com
